"The Early Part of the Breeding Season" by Pete Decort

By February most bird breeders will have all their pairs sorted. They will be watching their birds, especially the Hens. Cocks will be singing and dancing along the perches. Hens will be picking up bits and pieces and maneuvering said bits along their beaks preparing themselves for building nests and breeding.

This was always my favourite part of the year.

When I paired up I used to sit and watch, then put pans in and watch the Hens start to build, then let the Cocks in and hopefully see them mating. Then the anticipation of the first egg. When the Hen started to lay I never removed the eggs as they were laid. I tried to anticipate when the eggs would hatch so, after 13 days, I would go into the shed and look into the cage to see if anything had hatched. Sometimes it would be as many as 17 or 18 days before any hatching happened. But when an egg or eggs hatched I was over the moon to see the little bundles in the nest. I always used to think or hope after 3 or 4 days that if chicks were still alive they had a good chance of survival. But, alas, this was not always the way, and some died. Sometimes it was the whole nest. Hens would squash or not feed the young. I used to hate this part of breeding and used to ask why but no amount of reasoning would work. Why would a mother go to the bother of making a nest, laying eggs, hatching young, feed for anywhere up to 12 or 13 days and then just turn their backs on them?

Some breeders thought the Hens wanted to go back to nest or the Hens were sweating. I could never make up my mind. It was not for the lack of different food or clean cages and no mite. So why do you think this occurs?

But this is something that happens to us all, so we put it behind us and carry on.

"Another Memory" by Pete Decort

At a Club Meeting many many years ago I was listening to some British Bird Members saying how hard it had been that year to breed British Birds. Then, one day shortly after this my wife and I were going round some Nurseries and as we walked into one at Stapleford Abbots on the ledge of a poly tunnel door we saw a Chaffinch Cock fly through, straight onto the ledge of the door frame. "He's tame", or words to that effect, I said to my wife, but when we got inside to my amazement there was a Chaffinch feeding it's young on it's nest. I stood there watching the Cock and Hen come and go. One of the staff had seen me watching and came over to me and we spoke about the birds.

He called over another chap who turned out to be the owner. I told him who I was and he offered to let me take some photos of said birds. So I shot home and went back with a camera. He set up some small steps so I could get high enough to photograph the nest of Chaffinch young.

He then took me on a tour of nests in the yard and surrounding bushes and sheds.

Behind one shed was a pile of plant pots. Inside one was a Robin happily sitting on her newly hatched young. As we walked round he showed me the inside of the staff toilet. On top of the cistern was a Pied Wagtail on it's nest of eggs. There was another Pied Wagtail further down the yard in a pile of old logs sitting happily.

When I looked up in a large greenhouse, it had a fan whizzing round. We stood for a short while to watch a Robin fly through the blade to go to it's nest in the greenhouse. When you think of it this was a busy nursery with staff and customers walking round all day.

We moved across to one side of the Nursery which was a line of bushes in which he had Greenfinches and Song Thrushes nesting and, further down, there were Blackbirds nesting.

In the tops of the trees the Goldfinches and Greenfinches were singing like mad. Down at the bottom end of the Nursery was the river (Stamford Rivers). I didn't see this part as he said he had Kingfishers nesting so he didn't want to disturb them, but in the trees around the Nursery was a Rookery (outskirts) so you can guess what the noise was like.

A lovely place to work. I'm sorry I can't show you the photos as over the years they have been lost.

I remained friends with this chap till he died a few years ago. (Another memory).


