

"Early or Late" by Paul Jupe

Bird keeping, how difficult can it be? Bird breeding, now that's a different matter!

On a personal level my last two breeding seasons have been disastrous due to a hurried house move. But now I have had the opportunity to reestablish a new set up, albeit on a much smaller scale, with just ten modest flights and a tiny six by four shed for storage. It's amazing how quickly a stud can lose so much quality in just a couple of poor or, as in my case, disastrous breeding seasons.

Now, I have but two cock Greenfinches from the quality line of birds that took several years to develop. I brought in some hens to pair with the two cock Greenies. One hen had fertile eggs from two rounds and the other pair have yet to produce a single fertile egg!! I did try to run the cock Greenies with two hens each, but this turned out very unsatisfactory with far too much bickering and sadly I lost what was probably the best hen I had. One of the flights measured six by three feet and the other measured nine by three feet. It was in the larger flight that I lost the hen Greenie.

I am a firm believer in not starting breeding too early in the year. The pairing up of finches for hybridization is traditionally done in December or January to help to create a bond between the pair. I pair my straight pairs in March or April, often, due to practical reasons, this may happen in May. Our weather these days is fickle and unreliable, as are some of our birds. Not only do birds need around 14 hours daylight, they also both need to be fully fit and, despite our own interventions with feeding extra quality seeds, wild green foods and the introduction of commercial additives into the food and water, nature also has to be ready. Insects, plants, daylight, temperature and the weather all contribute to the ideal breeding conditions. When breeding in outdoor flights these conditions rarely occur early in the year and it is surprising how so many of us are experiencing clear first rounds. Many of us can't wait to get started breeding. Early breeding successes are very welcome and are posted on social media with videos

and on online forums. These early successes among others, and certainly in my case, create an atmosphere where I can be fooled or lured into starting too early, by which I mean one or both the selected birds in a pair are not truly fit. For those of us with outdoor aviaries, starting too early only results in clear rounds with the expenditure of all that wasted energy by the hen and the accompanying disappointment for ourselves.

I find it difficult to assess the true fitness of my birds. The Goldfinch loses its black on its beak and develops a completely clear beak. The Bramble finch beak goes from a bone colour to a black and the Chaffinch beak goes to a gun metal blue colour. When in breeding condition a bird will have an alertness, a restlessness and an intensity in its actions, as well as looking at its best, plumage wise.

In conclusion, I remember once at one of our CBS meetings we were discussing how the breeding season had gone now that most pairs had finished nesting. Typically it was a mixed response with some having done very well and others, not so well. When it came to one particular member he announced that he had bred none!! But after the moult, then he would have a head count and then decide how many young birds he had.

So with that thought in mind, I wish you all good fortune as the breeding season draws to a close and all the best during the moult.
