### "A Fostering Story" by Paul Jupe

I echo Brenda's concerns from the June newsletter and hope that I also don't provoke the response, oh no, not him again. But here goes.

Bird keeping for many of us is a series of highs and lows with intermittent periods of calm. This year my own breeding season has been cut short due to an imminent house move, so the few young I have been able to breed have become very precious. I found it necessary to foster out one of four pied Greenfinches.

Whilst ringing the four young I realised one was much smaller than the others and would probably not survive. I placed the chick under a hen greenfinch who was sitting on five clear eggs. I removed three eggs leaving two. The rearing of the chick has been a success and the chick has just left the nest, it is very light with dark marking around each eye and a dark mark on its neck and is sharing the flight with a recently acquired pair of Skylarks. Why? Well that's another story.

The larks have made a nest, which is a depression on the ground in one corner of the flight. The depression was much deeper than I expected. However the larks have filled the depression generously with dried grasses and moss. My fostered pied greenfinch has adopted the larks cosy nest as its own and is very happy to sit in its new ground level home and call/beg food from its mother in its warm bed. The chick reminds me of a human teenager, eating its meals in its own room, I wonder if it also plans to put posters on the aviary wall?

I shall have to be content with the few successes that I have gained from this disrupted breeding season. I hope your highs outnumber the lows this year and when we finally get the chance to meet again, we can recount those stories of the past year to one and other, the lows and the highs, the failures and the successes, the disasters and the triumphs.
