At June's meeting we had vet Agata Witkowska from Trinity Vet Centre in Kent to come and talk about some of the questions the Members had asked about. A lot was discussed about "Going Light" and the different reasons that cause this in our birds. It was very clear that there were several elements to this disease so it was not a simple answer, and Agata gave us an insight into all the possible reasons why some of our birds contract this disease and possible medications we can give them. What was interesting to hear was that some of our birds already have some of the elements of the disease in them but show no ill effect. Along the lines of humans that have good bacteria and bad bacteria in their bodies.

So this talk gave us another insight to the one Colin Leask from "Birds First["] in Scotland gave us in March this year regarding the Health, Environment and Nutrition for our birds.

At the end of her presentation Agata went on to answer other questions that the Members had, and also stayed to answer people's individual questions.

Thank you to everyone who managed to get to the meeting. We had over 40 Members present which seems to be the norm at Dagenham now. Agata remarked what a friendly Club we were, which again seems to be the view of people not connected to the Club, so well done to all involved in making Dagenham CBS the great Club it is.
