The President's Comments

If you have decided that for some reason you will not be staying at the Club, I hope you have enjoyed the time you have spent with us. I will be sorry not to see you again. So may I, on behalf of the Club, wish you all the best with your birds and all you want from life.

I personally have retired from bird keeping but I still love to hear from people how their birds are doing, but, more importantly, how the breeding season has commenced. If you have any problems, please ask a Member of the Club as we may have an answer or at least be able to help with your problem.

The family of a friend of mine who died a few years back has given me a lot of bird books – five or six full boxes. So, I will be putting them up for donations at the next Meeting I can get to.

This is my favourite time of year when most things break into life. The trees and plants start to waken from their winter sleep. The trees with flowers and leaf buds adorning their branches, the early spring bulbs and plants showing their heads and dancing in the wind. Even the rain seems to sparkle as the droplets land on the new leaves and we think everything is right with the world. Unfortunately, we know it really is not, but we can only take pleasure in what we can see around us.

I look out at the birds and see them getting their summer plumage, dancing and singing to attract mates, chasing each other around and getting a bit territorial. Because of the bad weather we have not been since before Christmas so when we do get back, we will have a lot of work catching up. I have started some seeds off in the shed, but because of the bad light they have gone a bit leggy so may not be any good and I'll have to start again.

I have been in touch with Avigenics the DNA people to see if they will come and do a talk at one of our vacant monthly meetings, just waiting on them to confirm dates, so watch this space.

March's Meeting This is the First Round of the Dagenham CBS Show League 2024

As you know we have changed the format of the show to try to give a more balanced outcome.

Members can only enter the maximum of 4 Birds for each show (£1.00 per cage)

Judges

Paul Jupe – British John Young – Canaries Peter De Cort – Foreign

Judges will judge each section 1st to 15^{th.} Any birds outside these positions will be awarded 5 points.

Points for each position are as follows $-1^{st} = 150$, $2^{nd} = 140$, $3^{rd} = 130$, $4^{th} = 120$, $5^{th} = 110$, $6^{th} = 100$, $7^{th} = 90$, $8^{th} = 80$, $9^{th} = 70$, $10^{th} = 60$, $11^{th} = 50$, $12^{th} = 40$, $13^{th} = 30$, $14^{th} = 20$, $15^{th} = 10$ points.

If there are less than 15 birds in a section the points will be diluted down as per the below examples:

- Only 5 birds in a section, $1^{st} = 50$, 2nd = 40, $3^{rd} = 30$, $4^{th} = 20$, $5^{th} = 10$ points.
- Only 3 birds in a section, $1^{st} = 30$, $2^{nd} = 20$, $3^{rd} = 10$ points

Best bird in show from the 3 sections will receive 25 bonus points.

All members' scores will be calculated together to create the Show League Table.

Best Foreign – £10.00 + Rosette

"The 2024 Kent Show" "A Thoroughly enjoyable, satisfying day out" By Paul Jupe

Sunday the 18th of February was the London & Home Counties British Bird & Mule Club Show at Cuxton in Kent. A big thank you to Dave and Geoff for putting on such a well-run show and to Terry for his judging. Like all shows there is always an army of volunteers in the background, the stewards and other helpers who set up the venue then later, pack everything away at the end of the show. To the ladies in the kitchen supplying a constant flow of hot drinks to wash down the bacon and sausage rolls, thank you. And a big thank you to Dave's wife, who I only know as V, who was constantly busy throughout the show organising the prize monies and compiling the catalogue etc.

There are many unsung heroes throughout the country that give up their time and offer their skills freely to make each and every show the best it can be.

On a really busy birdie weekend with our Dagenham Sales Day on the Saturday, then on Sunday the BKA sales event in Thurrock and the show in Kent, many would have gone to their beds exhausted Sunday night. Sunday's Show Hall in Kent had a centre isle full of superb Mules and Hybrids with a huge variety of types, all a credit to their owners. There were fewer Norwich than I remember from previous shows, however all were of good quality. As is often the case these days Redpolls were very well represented and many of them were stunning, nice and dark and of good type. It was very satisfying to see some lovely softbills at the show. Softbills add an extra dimension to a show and are often really well represented at the Eastern Fed. show in March at Risby Suffolk. Most British hardbills were to be seen on the benches and, in particular, the Siskins shone in the same way they have done these past couple of seasons.

For me, and going back to the beginning of this article, I had the greatest satisfaction in receiving two seconds in the competitive Greenfinch cock classes. One from a flighted cock, which was an outcross that I was

pleased to have bred from. The other second place was a for a CYB cock Greenie which gives me confidence my breeding plans are back on track.
