> <u>"Lifelong Learning"</u> (A story of carbolic soap and the Internet)

Having kept birds in one form or another for around fifty years, mostly as pet birds, I have always done things my own way. That is not to say that my way is the only way. I've always tried to learn from others and I like to take aspects of other bird keepers methods and practices and adapt them to my own setup.

I've enjoyed keeping various canary breeds and have had a passion for British Finches throughout the whole time. Over the years I have kept birds in cages, in small sheds, in small aviaries and in large planted mixed aviaries all with varying degrees of success and failure. Keeping British birds purely for the enjoyment of seeing them close up and breeding in captivity I rarely bothered to ring them, then around six or seven years ago I joined the Basildon CBS and also the BBC and purchased rings. Since then I have been able to participate in the local show scene, which has opened a whole new aspect of bird keeping to me, which I enjoy very much.

I am a great advocate of bird accommodation with plenty of fresh air, sunlight and only protecting the birds from the very worst of the elements, although these days I have made their enclosures a little more comfortable for my own benefit. Natural green food is given as much and as often as possible, although these days it seems harder and harder to maintain a clean safe supply. Like many bird keepers I usually have a bag in my coat pocket just in case I spot a nice clump of fresh dandelion, chickweed or other edible weed or berries. Often in the past and to the greatest embarrassment of my children I would collect these green foods from the borders of front gardens locally when going about our daily business.

It pays to have an open mind. For years I have used plastic coated garden wire to secure nest felts into nest pans, this works well enough, but the more determined birds peck at the felts and often all that remains in the nest pan is a small fragment of felt attached to the wire !!

I don't use social media, face book, etc, it works for some but not for me. Nevertheless I find YouTube very useful particularly if you need to fix something or get ideas. I picked up on a YouTube channel from C&A birds, called O C Aviary, produced and presented by a very enthusiastic young man, Oliver Crowther. Oliver demonstrated how he glues his nest felts in using carbolic soap, something I had heard about, but never seen. I bought a block of carbolic soap, grated it, added a little warm water to some of the grated soap, smeared it onto the reverse of the nest felt and pressed the felt into the nest pan and left it to dry for about an hour. Apparently the carbolic soap has the added benefit of repelling mite.

Fifty years of bird keeping and there's still plenty to learn, well done Oliver for demonstrating this in such a modern way.

It really does pay to have an open mind, we can learn from the young, as well as the not so young.




