Richard is in constant talks with the people who we rent the hall from so I will assume we will have more news soon.

In our last Newsletter Richard spoke about the new staging. When we get this I was wondering where it will be stored. I do not think we can take a chance on keeping it in the shed or store we use now (nice little earner for the scrap man) so I was wondering if we should think of asking if there is somewhere inside the Hall we could store it. Just a thought!

I recently went with my family for a week on Mersea Island. Very disappointing. The only good thing I saw was a huge amount of Pied Wagtails. I didn't count them but there must have been 40 to 50 in one flock.

Also Starlings – there must have been a flock of 100 to 150 flying around and roosting in the trees around our caravan. I sat on the steps to the van and a little Cock Robin came right up to my feet. There were also a pair of Blackbirds and the usual Pigeons and Gulls.

We were coming back from a short trip and we saw a chap with a Falcon on his arm. (I thought to myself why can't I get a nice bird on my arm!!)

We stopped him and he let my grandson have some photos taken of him stroking the bird. Highlight of the week.

Since I wrote about the Hall I have had Richard on the phone about re-opening the Hall.

If the Committee agrees this will be for the October Meeting. Richard has spoken to the Hall Committee and they said we are allowed up to 40 Members in the Hall.

We would enter at one side of the Hall and leave at the other side. We will have to social distance to some degree, and use the sanitisers supplied at the doors.

The kitchen would be open to serve tea/coffee and cakes. No rolls though.

Barry says he would do the raffle from a table, probably somewhere near the Kitchen rather than circulating, so if you could help him with this I would be obliged.

So please bear with us, we will hope to open in October with a few restrictions and if we do go ahead I hope you will all feel safe enough to come along and meet your friends. Looking forward to seeing you all again.

Don't forget to bring your masks or visors as they will probably be needed.

When I was talking with Richard I mentioned the staging and its safety. He said he would get another lock for the shed, but I have asked him if there is some sort of lock-up inside the Hall we could hire. He is going to enquire.

Also, whilst we were speaking He asked about subs for next year. I said we used this year's subs to pre-pay for the Hall (Meetings and Shows). Also as you know, we have been sending out Newsletters. Stamps alone are currently over £30 per month so all the income we had for this year has almost been spent. It came to pass that we agreed on free subs next year for all paid-up Members for 2020. A few people I have spoken to say perhaps it should be half subs. I would like your views please at the October Meeting.

We are trying to sort out about the pre-paid hall fees and whether we will get the money back or have free meeting nights to counter this year's loss of revenues.

On another topic – If anyone wants to sell any birds or equipment the Committee would like you to make sure cages and equipment are thoroughly cleaned.

The Crimson Capped Assassin

The Redpoll is a bird that always gladdens the heart. Its diminutive size belies its enormous character. Always busy and inquisitive the Redpoll is a joy to keep and constantly entertains. I used to keep three or four pairs and had a great deal of success breeding with them over twelve or fifteen years ago. They would go down and have three or four rounds and rear good sized clutches successfully. Once moulted I would pass on most of the young to a dealer or a trader as a job lot, none sexed. I just kept a few of the darkest and those showing the most colour. During those productive years I never saw any signs of aggression, just a little squabbling to establish a pecking order!

Turn the clock forward to today and after not keeping Redpolls for many years I find myself with a trio, two hens and a cock from separate studs, perfect. I first run them together in a large flight cage, six by two by eighteen inches deep, throughout April. In May I placed some nest sites and a little cover, sadly there were no signs of breeding activity. I tried putting the slides in and separating them for a few days and then reintroducing the birds in various combinations, hens separated, cock with one hen or the other, still no signs of breeding. Then in June I put the trio in a double breeder as I needed the flight cages for other youngsters. Within a few days the cock paired up with one of the hens, so I placed the other hen in the double breeder directly above. I watched the cock tread the hen a few times over the next couple of days and as he was interfering with her nest building I thought it a good idea if I placed him with the spare hen poll in the double breeder above. The cock Redpoll jumped in and sat alongside the hen and began to feed her, happy days. When I returned forty minutes later the hen was dead, lying face down in a pool of blood

with a long deep wound from her shoulders down to the middle of her back. The cock with his freshly enriched crimson chest feathers was the obvious culprit. I left the cock and surviving hen separate for a day then cautiously returned them together. So far, no problems then again, no eggs either. I'm no Redpoll expert, I was looking back to the past when it seemed so easy to breed a plentiful number of Redpoll youngsters. I fear at this rate I may end up with a minus Redpoll count rather than a plus.

Perhaps there is a darker side to the Redpoll that I was not aware of. I still think they're great and I still love their character, but in the future I shall not be quite so trusting in their nature, or was I just unlucky with a rogue poll?

I hope you enjoyed reading my escapade of cleaning Border/Fife show cages from the August newsletter, and had a good laugh at my expense! No, I never suffered any lasting problems or issues!
