BARKING COLLEGE OF ADULT EDUCATION. Development at the College since its reorganisation in 1972 has been directed towards increasing the variety of adult leisure-time activities and improving the quality of courses. Increased use of visual and aural teaching aids and planned recruitment and training of tutors has done this. There are day classes in domestic crafts, commercial subjects, language, and motor maintenance; and evening classes in arts, cookery, crafts, dancing, drama, GCE languages, music, needlework, remedial subjects, shorthand, sports and games, typewriting, and yoga.

CAGE BIRD SECTION. The Dagenham and District Cage Bird Society invite all bird fanciers to visit the section. All species of birds are catered for. Each month, at meetings, lectures or film shows are given by specialists. The members are only too pleased to help anyone interested in birds.

DOG SECTION. This section has a wonderful reputation in the interest of the Canine World and particularly in helping the younger handlers to parade their dogs. The Kennel Club has helped in the formation of three Obedience Classes and the judges appointed are always of the highest standard and experience. This year they are: Exemption and Novelty Classes, Mr. P. Whittaker, Allrounder; and Obedience Classes, Mrs. C. Mahon.

HANDICRAFTS SECTION. Displayed in this section are the artistic, original and skilful efforts of men, women and children achieved during their leisure hours.
