# The President's Comments

#### <u>Birds</u>

Two weeks ago myself and my family went to my daughter's chalet in Yarmouth to do some work on the chalet. Whilst having a relax from working I took a walk. As I was walking along the road I could hear Goldfinches and Greenfinches. It was the Greenfinches that got my attention, sitting on the roof tops and phone wires. Because it is some years since I last saw Greenfinches I just stood watching them. Then, to my amazement, they flew down within feet of me, foraging in the grass, pulling it up, then flying off with it in their beaks. I continued to stand there and watch the Goldfinches on the same area of grass they were not pulling up the grass, just feeding.

I walked a bit further down the road. I then took, what I thought was a short cut between the caravans and was amazed at the amount of Blackbirds wandering around on the grass. It was amazing,

All around were Pied Wagtails not more than a few feet from me and taking no notice of me.

Recently, with Barry and Ken's help, I took the roof of my bird shed. The weather forecast was for a sunny day, so I was up early and started to remove the roof. We had to be a bit careful because our Gouldians were starting to go to nest. Anyway, we got the roof done without too much disturbance to the birds.

I then, as previously said, went to my daughter's chalet, and left Barry in charge of the birds. When I came home I was amazed to see young Gouldians in the box. This goes to show how much noise you can get away with.

Our next Meeting is a talk by Steve Dominey. The topic will be Yorkshires and Fifes. I hope you can get to the Club and show Steve some support. See you there.

#### Down Sizing – How Difficult It Is From Paul Jupe

Previously I had plenty of space, with twenty flights, mostly 6x3 feet with a couple of 6x6 and I also enjoyed having a 12x20 feet shed with a few flights and some cages.

British finches need a bit of space when you keep them in flights and when I started keeping Pied Greenfinches as well as maintaining a stud of normal Greenfinches, I simply built more flights.

There are so many different wonderful species of British finch it's hard to limit one's collection to just a few breeds.

I thought it might be nice to try and breed a few hybrids, so I acquired a few European Bullfinches and some cock Goldfinches. Although I enjoy the Sib bullies, I soon thought it would be great to have some native bullies also.

I've always enjoyed keeping some of the smaller finches, such as Siskins, Linnets and Redpolls and before you know it, I have eighty birds in flights and some cages!!

And now I have moved house I have but ten 6x3 flights, what to keep? My 2021 breeding season was abruptly stopped due to the house move so I only bred a very few young. My best looking young Pied Greenfinches did not flourish and I lost them one by one before the moult, therefore I shall only keep normal Greenfinches in the future. I kept the young Greenfinches in family groups in flight cages and fear they might have experienced stress and that may have been the cause of their demise.

I have had the greatest breeding success with sib bullies rather than the native bullies and shall concentrate on sibs this year. Some of my most reliable pairs are not as young as they used to be. It's very difficult to let successful pairs go, but bullies only have a relatively short breeding life.

To maintain my interest in hybrids this year I shall keep a mixed group together in a couple of flights, Bullfinch, Goldfinch, Linnet and Redpoll and see if I get lucky. My preferred method of hybridisation is to have one pair to each flight, but without the space that would be impossible. Keeping a couple of flights for hybrids, selecting just a few pairs of Greenfinches and a few pairs of Bullies only leaves a couple of flights free for other birds. Fortunately I have three all wire flight cages, that, if successful, I can house some young!!

So downsizing what to keep? The best young unrelated pairs would be sensible, and there are a number of old favourites that have a degree of sentimental attachment, a few geriatrics, some with a foot missing or a dropped wing, plus the inevitable hen hybrid. What to do?
