Mick is also very generous donating money for "Spot the Member" and donating birds for the Christmas Raffle making hundreds of pounds for the club. He also often donates prizes for the monthly raffle. All in all Mick is a top bloke and a credit to this club. Thank you Mick.



April's Meeting

This month Steve Chennells will be giving a talk on Line Breeding. This is a continuation of the talk he gave in August last year and he has sent in the following recap of that talk as a reminder....

At the August 2024 club meeting, we discussed the advantages and disadvantages of Inbreeding, Step 1 to 4 of the Foundation Stage. By adhering to this breeding formula, the breeder will never need to introduce any outside blood from other breeders.

We discussed the genetic effects of inbreeding, linebreeding. We also discussed how inbreeding can result in the fixation of both deleterious (negative consequences) as well as advantageous genetic traits. Examples are given of the general reduction in wellbeing and fertility that result from inbreeding (known as inbreeding depression), as well as traits that have been improved through inbreeding.

Special note of interest: All breeders who maintain a single breed of bird are practicing some degree of inbreeding. However, the level of inbreeding varies considerably with different breeding strategies and goals.

Most people abandon a family once they begin to notice serious faults, and believe that the family is weak or genetically contaminated. Not knowing

better, they panic and get rid of the family, only to start over with something new. A family that expresses sudden genetic faults, or health issues (not related to disease), is an indication that your birds are bred too close, and requires a little in family genetic diversity, or an infusion of new blood from within your own strain.

Stage 1, (Foundation stock) many of you are not able to get great birds from great breeders; you are forced to start where you are, with what you have. Or get the best birds possible from family and friends. However, the birds we get are most likely the product of In and In breeding or outcrossing. My foundation program was created for breeders like you, who are interested in creating your own strains. I'm here to tell you that it is certainly possible.

Stage 2 (maximising the genetic value of your foundation birds) preferably healthy, vigour and without defects, when initially breeding brother x sister you would potentially save years of additional backcrossing.

Back-crossing is used when the parents (the cock and hen are half siblings) or are not related, and the offspring are not meeting your expectations, or more importantly, the offspring are not measurably in some areas better than their parents. Back-Crossing is used when we need to get more from ONE of the parent birds, whichever one you deem superior to the other, you must back-cross to one of the offspring, this may be fruitful on just one breeding or multiple times. You must use the next generation to breed back to the mother or father, for the best results, you must dispose of the rejected partner, never to be used again in the future within your mainline of your inbreeding program.

Stage 3 (inbreeding) By breeding brother to sister, in successive generations, you "lock-in" their characteristics and traits. This is known as Fixation of Traits, as a breeder you will do this (inbreeding: brother to sister) two or three times, consecutively. The closer they can inbreed, especially in the beginning of their program, the better they can "Fix" or "Lock" the genes. As long as you do not experience a lack of vigour (the first signs of "Inbreeding Depression") they will be able to handle the close inbreeding. Remember, the offspring will visually indicate the worth of the parents and not the worth of the offspring.

In Stage 3, we mentioned that you can inbreed brother to sister consecutively, for a number of generations. Well. this is very true at this

Stage. If you've begun Stage 3 with the brother or sister that has the right type, conformation, and expresses the correct performance ability, health & fertility/hatchability, and represents his breed and variety, and you are breeding him to his best brother or sister, expressing the same qualities, you are in great shape!

Stage 4, helps you "Transition from inbreeding to line-breeding" and establishing multiple lines that prevents you from inbreeding to the point of reaching inbreeding depression, a very important stage, make sure you do this stage explicitly, you are accurately setting up the next Stage of the Foundation Program.

Once you have achieved suitable fixation and uniformity, and have bred and acquired at least two generations of offspring, from these continuous inbreeding – we will select our birds to head our line-breeding programs. However, it's important, at this time, to set up a minimum of 3 lines for stage 5 (line-breeding).

Start by selecting the best Cock bird (let's call him Adam Red) from this final "Stage 4 Generation" and breed him to his mother. And, select the best 2 Hens (let's call them Eve White and Eve Blue) and breed them back to their father.

We now have the 3 lines required for the line-breeding program in stage 5.

Special Note: Their mother and father are no longer part of the program. We will move forward with Adam Red and Eve White and Eve Blue. They will head the new line-breeding programs

Before we can move to stage 5, these birds must be of the highest quality, and worthy of cloning. Once we have birds worthy of cloning, these birds will now become your new starting point, and will head your line-breeding program in stage 5.

At the April 2005 meeting I will discuss Linebreeding and the three line solution that offsets inbreeding depression, stage 5 through to 8 of the breeding program, with diagrams to help visualise what is being discussed.

Team Dagenham

Myself & Davy Hunt are Dagenham CBSs Delegates for the BBC (British Bird Council). We are the first of any CBSs to be asked to be involved in this way and sat in on our first meeting at last week's AGM.

The committee was very keen to know how Dagenham operates and feel they can learn a lot from us. Also on the agenda was the Bird Registration, see below for guidance –

There has been a lot of debate about this registration and it has developed and changed as DEFRA worked on its implementation, but its introduction has been inevitable.

It is now a legal requirement as of 1st October 2024 to register your birds under the circumstances detailed below (1st September in Scotland)

It is quite straightforward and simple to register.

It is for the protection of the poultry industry and of course for human health as well.

There is a registration phone number you can use OR fill in the forms from the links below.

Keepers of LESS than 50 Birds

When you DO need to register:

You DO need to register passeriformes (softbills and Finches / Canaries)

- If they are kept in aviaries with a certain amount of access to outside air, that can include the sides of aviary being open mesh
- If your birds are taken outdoors at any time, to be taken to bird gatherings or shows, they MUST be registered.

When you DO NOT need to register:

You do NOT need to register passeriformes (such as softbills and <u>Finches</u> / Canaries) if they are both

- fully housed in a dwelling (your home or another indoor structure such as a bird room / shed)
- with no access to the open air

However - If your birds are taken outdoors at any time, to be taken to bird gatherings, sales or shows, they MUST be registered.

Keepers of MORE than 50 Birds

You MUST register if you have 50 birds or more:

You are required by law to register any premises where you have 50 or more birds, whether they be inside or outside.
