This Year's Breeding Season

How has everyone got on with their breeding season this year? As usual, I didn't pair up until Easter. As of July 19, I still had 4 pairs due to hatch if eggs are full (I never check them, preferring to wait for a surprise!). As you know I'm a Fife breeder, at today's count of chicks we have 80, certainly not as many as last year, but the quality has improved which is more important. Actually there wasn't much difference between the number of chicks bred between round 1 or 2, but I did experience a few dead in shell this year. It appears to me that a number of breeders have sadly suffered from the dreaded 'Mite'.

I give my sincere thanks to Roger Mack, Nigel Breese, Gary MacBeath, Richard Wilson and James Bavister for their invaluable advice early in the year on products to help eradicate the problem. Roger and Nigel for advising to use the brown diatom powder, in preference to white powder, Gary for using Clean & Clear Check Mite, Richard for using Mil Ban and James for using Green 7. To me, a club is all about passing on useful information, especially to Novices.

My regime this year took on a much stricter procedure than ever before. First is the use of **Red Stop** in the drinking water, initially used for 10 days, then 1x week thereafter. I have used this for about 4 years now and only lost a handful of birds that had mite BUT I believe that is due to a poorly bird not drinking. I understand Aviform now have a very similar product out on the market.

Nest felts were smothered in **Diatom**, then repeated when eggs were set (dust everywhere!). It was also spread under trays and mixed in with floor covering. **Mil Ban** was painted on nest hooks and blocks which twist onto cage fronts Last year that was a severe breeding ground for mite, this year nothing! It was also painted in runners where divider boards sit and wherever else mite would breed. **Green 7** was used to wash all cages before repainting (plastic cages before sealing gaps), and then used to wash down during breeding season.

My perches are checked for mite and 'dunked' in boiling water EVERY DAY for 2 reasons. Perch ends are ideal for mite to hide and breed, **boiling water** will kill them, if I find mite, I spray the cage front where that perch sits with **Clean & Clear Check Mite**. The other reason is, dirty perches can lead to eye problems in birds! They get an eye irritation, then rub their face along a perch that is covered in residue from their droppings, infection then sets in, causing distress! PREVENTION is better than CURE!

The Holy Grail of Hybrids

Ken Grigg, Dagenham & District and IOA member has achieved the Holy Grail of the British Bird, Mule & Hybrid world by breeding a Siskin x Bullfinch. Some people may say how lucky this achievement is, but this is no accident or a lucky coincidence. Ken has tried this pairing for over 30 years and talking from his home in Kent with his wife Jean has said that over this period he has had around 400 clear eggs from this pairing. Yet year after year Ken sets out his breeding plans for the bird room and now has defied the odds and produced a stunning specimen (see photo below).

Ken is no stranger to success, only last year being awarded the Order of Merit award from the IOA, only one of twelve of the Greatest Birdmen in the country to receive such an honour. He has been a breeder for over 60 years and has been the general secretary of the Southern Norwich Plain Head Club for over 40 years and has been an OMJ judge since the 80's.

He has competed & judged in many countries also winning gold medals at the world show.

The list of so many great achievements goes on, but many of us know Ken at the grass roots level of this hobby. At Dagenham & District Cage Bird Society, Ken mucks in with helping at shows and meetings, he always has a kind word of encouragement or advice for members young and old.

If ever there was a story of not giving up this would be it. Going through 30 years of disappointment and crushed plans and dreams to finally succeed where so many have tried and failed is testament to the man and our great hobby.
