### **Barry's Aviary**

Following are a few pictures of my aviary and outdoor flight. It is made from a second hand shed which I altered by fitting some windows that are hinged from the top to prevent rain getting in when they are opened. There is an internal flight which is connected to the outside flight via a bob hole where the birds can come and go as they wish. This is left open all year round. In the winter it is heated with a small 4 fin oil filled radiator (bought from Dunelm) connected by a plug in thermostat set at 5 degrees and is efficient in keeping the birdroom from getting too cold. I keep a variety of different birds including different types of finches, canaries and one pair of budgies which I enjoy keeping as pets and like to watch them all year round. When the sun is shining especially in the summer our garden is filled with birdsong and our neighbours love it. I don't specifically breed for showing as my birds aren't quite up to spec as they normally pair themselves up in the flight so not producing true breed birds. I breed a few in cages to keep their true breed and if any of them look slightly promising I enter a few in the shows just for a bit of fun and to support the club. Fran helps me clean them out. While I am cleaning the aviary she is washing all the feed and water containers. She is also called when the birds need their claws trimming as her eyesight is better than mine. Fran and I were both brought up with birds as both her dad and mine had aviaries and we inherited their birds. My dad sadly passed away in 1987 and one of the birds I inherited from him was a male red billed Quelea. I have no idea how long he had it but it only died last year in 2019 making it at least 32+ years old. We are very lucky because if ever we are away Val and her husband Ken look after the birds for us.
