# "Memories" by Pete Decort

In my many years at Dagenham CBS I have met some truly wonderful people and made some lifelong friends – and they have to be friends to put up with me!

In the past I have run coach outings not only to The National, but to zoos and also outings where we had trips around the Essex countryside, finishing at different pubs that were doing BBQ nights. But one of the best things we arranged was when we had Disco Nights. These were mainly at Fords Social Centre at Rush Green and they earned quite a bit of money for our Club and for Rainham CBS. I had a very good friend who was well in the know at Fords. Some of you may remember him – Denis Morley. He arranged the hall and I and some others sold tickets. People flocked to get these and it was nothing to sell 150–200 tickets. I knew a DJ called Manhatten Sound. By knowing all these people we saved a lot of money. People from the Club used to bring family and friends. These were great nights.

At Rainham Club we would have Club Party Nights and Christmas Parties for the Members' children. All the children used to get Christmas presents. Alas, like many other Clubs, all gone. Shame.

In the meantime, me and a mate of mine got an allotment. Unfortunately he died not long after so I was left on my own. After a while I got to know people running the Allotment Shop so I got involved in helping out there.

This was one of the best things I ever did, because I met two of the nicest people you could ever wish to meet. You might have guessed who they are – Val and her brother Barry. Barry had birds so he and Val came to the Club and you know what happened then. They got more and more involved.

Back at the Shop, amongst other things, we used to sell some bird seed and flowers. Soon we had like a mini pet shop. I started to sell some birds there and equipment. I also brought seed and plants to the Club for sale.

During this time, through the birds, we met a chap who had a Plant Nursery so we used to buy a lot of plants from him for the shop. If we ran short of plants then, with his permission, Barry and I used to go to the Nursery and help ourselves to what plants we required and when we next saw him we would pay for them. You would not find people so trusting now. Alas he died a year or so ago. Another good friend gone.

But I am happy to still have Barry and Val and of course Barry's wife, Fran. I can honestly say that without Barry over the past few years not only would I be lost, in a lot of ways, so would our Club. So, long may It continue. Thanks Barry, Val and Fran.

Because I have been a Member of our Club for so long, I have seen many Members come and go. Alas, too many have gone forever.

# "My other hobby" (apart from bird keeping) by Brenda Kettle

It was after we moved from Enfield in 2002 that I purchased my first computer which got me thinking about pursuing my other hobby 'Researching my Family Tree'. My tree on Ancestry has almost 8000 names listed for the 4 main lines starting with my grandparents.

Well, what an eye-opener it has been. On a couple of occasions in my research my eyes have popped out of my head on the end of stalks at what I was reading!!

My dad's line, the Poffleys', appear to have originated from East Garston in Berkshire with some of them moving down to North London. With help from a new found cousin we have traced that line back 9 generations. In that line, my 2<sup>nd</sup> great grandmother, Mary Plumb, was born in 1842 in Buckland, Herts, and died 1 May 1910, but it was where she died that was an eye opener – Broadmoor Asylum – and buried in an unmarked grave! Well, what did she do to finish up there?

At the end of June 1901 she was in Holloway Prison, charged with wounding her daughter, Martha Helen Poffley, with the intent to murder her and cause GBH! Martha, known as Ellen, was woken up by her mother trying to cut her throat with a razor, then later, her mother attempted to cut her own throat! She was found guilty at the Old Bailey and detained as a criminal lunatic in Holloway, later being sent to Broadmoor. Her husband, James, died in 1893, aged 52, and Mary was left to bring up their 9 children on her own. It was through her conviction at Broadmoor I managed to obtain photographs and further information of Mary. When I saw them I did feel so saddened for her. She looked so haggard like she'd had an extremely hard life. Strange as it is, out of her 5 daughters, 3 of them also appear to have finished up in some form of institution or asylum.

My second eye opener was on my mum's side of the family, the Greenwoods. In particular Christopher Samuel Greenwood 1861-1941, a great uncle to me, born in Holborn. An optical glass cutter by trade, married, had 3 children, 2 of whom died very young, as well as his wife. From 1891 he was diagnosed as being 'lunatic' in the North

London 'Colney Hatch Asylum'. I obtained information which included a photo of him, wow, sporting a full beard and 'spotty complexion' also being a redhead. That is strange, as my grandmother had 8 children and one of them was a redhead! Christopher, although 'lunatic' was classed as being very friendly, always willing to help others, never caused any problems and thought of himself as 'Jesus'! Sadly, his only surviving son, also named Christopher, committed suicide by car exhaust fumes in his car in 1965.

It has been a fantastic journey, actually meeting up with other 'cousins' along the way and exchanging information between us. I will of course understand, when we are all able to meet up again, if you decide not to sit next to me!!
