## Pete's Chit Chat

I wrote before about Barry lending me a Yellow Cock Fife. The Green Hen immediately went to nest and hatched four chicks. All fledged and were feeding well. In the meantime, the parents went back to nest. She laid five eggs. While she was sitting, three of the first chicks died one after the other for no apparent reason. I checked all usual things but could find no reason.

By now the next set of eggs had started to hatch. Four of the five eggs hatched. All grew well. They fledged and are growing well and feeding themselves.

By now the Hen had gone back to nest again. This time she laid five eggs and has hatched all five. All babies are doing well and are growing strong.

Unfortunately, one of the second round chicks died in what appears to be the same way as the first three. The third round chicks, as I write this article, are between 13 and 15 days old and are doing well.

Note, while I have been losing young Canaries, I have hatched some Gouldians. These are also doing well with none lost. As I write, the Hen is running around with nesting material. If she does lay again, I will remove the eggs.

I only have one flight so all the Gouldians and the one pair of Canaries and young, and Gouldians and young are all together in this flight. This is why I do not understand only young Canaries dying.

## "What Would You Have Done?" By Paul Jupe

This is the scenario, two flights 6 x 3 ft in a block of five, two pairs of Northern Bullfinches and other finches in the three other flights. Both Bullfinch pairs have young, three in flight A and five young in flight B. Flight B is two or three days ahead of flight A, both pairs of parents are feeding well and brooding the young closely at night. Flight B has all five young rung and it is around day five for the three young in flight A, they are ready to be rung. I place two BBC E sized rings on two in the nest, the third chick is a little smaller and an E ring would probably be too large, so I decide to place a D ring. The hen Bullfinch then returns to the three freshly rung young in flight A and all seems well.

Later at the evening feed two of the freshly rung chicks from flight A are on the floor and bleeding from their rung leg, obviously the hen Bullfinch has tried to remove the rings. The two chicks on the floor are alive, I foster one under a hen Greenfinch next door who is sitting on clear eggs and I place the other in the nest of five Bullies in flight B. The third Bullie chick in flight A is unharmed so I leave it. Sadly in the morning the one remaining chick in flight A is dead in the nest, clearly the hen Bullfinch had not returned to the nest and the chick died of cold overnight. In addition the chick placed under the hen Greenfinch was also dead the next day, however the chick placed with five others in flight B survived.

How could I have done things differently?

1. Perhaps I should have disguised the rings? In the past I have covered the white numbers and size letter of the BBC rings with black marker pen. Some people cover the ring with a rubber band. Because the other pair had not worried about the rings I didn't think to hide the white markings.

2. Should I have waited to around day six or seven and then placed the rings when the hen is less fastidious about cleaning the nest?

3. Perhaps my priority should have been to save the third chick that was unharmed, as you may remember the third chick in flight A was the smallest of the three but I didn't think it would have been able to compete with the larger chicks in flight B. I should have remembered that Bullfinch hens are prone to lose interest in smaller clutches of ones and twos.

4. I could have put all three chicks under the Greenfinch and just hoped for the best. The good thing was that the chick in the nest of five survived and left the nest, as did the five original occupants of the Bullfinch nest in flight B.

Without the benefit of hindsight what might you have done?

To win the prize you must be at the Meeting on Friday, the 10<sup>th</sup> December otherwise another ticket will be picked until a winner is declared.


The usual monthly raffle will still take place on the Friday night, with its £50.00 cash prize plus other prizes as normal.
