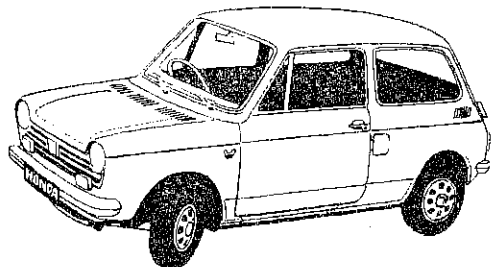
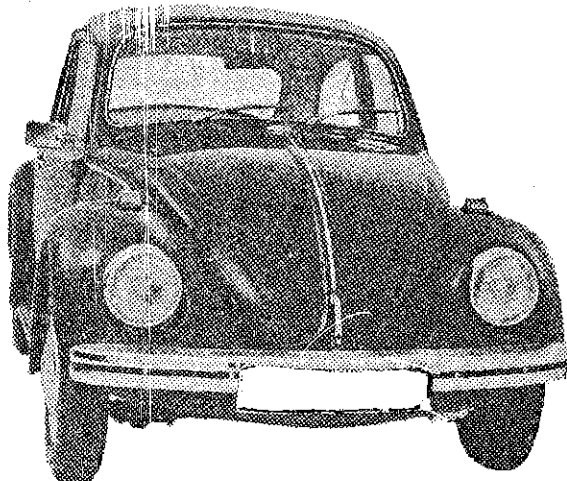

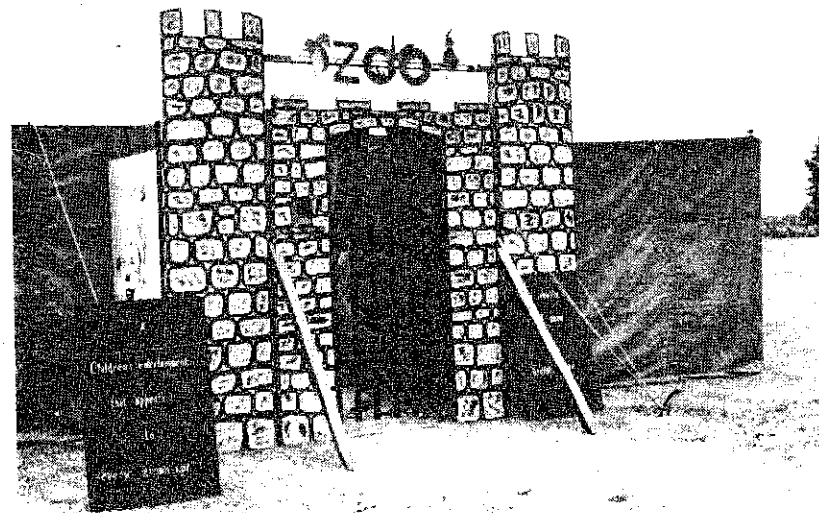
CAGE BIRDS SECTION

The Dagenham and District Cage Bird Society was formed 34 years ago in 1935 when a few people, moving into Dagenham from the London areas, who had been members of respective cage birds societies in those areas, decided to form a club in Dagenham, having for its objects, the cultivation and improvement of the various breeds of canaries and other cage birds, also to provide for discussion between fanciers which leads to mutual advantage for all members. Much progress has been made since that beginning, and now the Dagenham Society is among the best local societies in the South Essex area.

During the last war, the Dagenham club was one of the few Societies that kept going, members attended their meetings, bred their birds and shows were held which helped relieve the monotony of the war days, even though seed was difficult to obtain and bombs were dropping all around. After those rather nasty times, members returned from the forces and the Society soon got back into its stride, many new members were enrolled taking up the fancy, which includes four or five varieties of canary, budgerigars, all varieties of British birds and many species of Foreign birds. Altogether, these make a pleasing exhibition, as can be seen at the Town Show.

Today, the Society has over one hundred members and meetings are held every third Friday in the Heath Park Hall, when lectures on the various species are arranged, and slide shows are presented showing something of interest to everyone about bird life. Three shows are held every year plus the one at the Town Show; young bird shows in June and July and the Society's annual show in November, when all the Society's trophies are in competition as per the rule book. Any information by anyone thinking of taking up the bird fancy, can be readily obtained by enquiring at the Secretary's table in our marquee or from any of our stewards.
